

English Recruitment Exam

The English Recruitment Exam consists of two sections: The Grammar and Vocabulary Exam and the Reading Exam.

Grammar and Vocabulary Exam

There are 30 questions; all of them are multiple choice questions. The candidate must choose the correct answer and write the letter of the answer on the answer sheet. Only one of the four answers is the correct one in each question. Look at this example.

- The time allocated for the Grammar and Vocabulary Exam is 25 minutes.
- The total mark for the Grammar and Vocabulary Exam is 30 marks X 2 = 60 marks

Reading Exam

There is a short passage and three types of questions.

1. <u>Question 1:</u> Short-Answer Questions or WH-Questions: The candidate will find the correct answer from the passage:

EXAMPLE:

- Where is the businessman from?
- How old was he?
- Why did he die?
- 2. <u>Question 2:</u> Multiple-Choice Questions: The candidate must choose the best answer for each statement. The answer is in the given passage:

EXAMPLE:

1. John died at the age of ______.
a. 28 b. 45 c. 60 d. 75

3. Question 3: True, False, or Not Given:

The candidate reads the sentences and circle (T) for true (F) for false, or (NG) for Not Given:

EXAMPLE:

1. Bill G	ates studied at Harvard University		Т	F	NG

- The time allocated for the Reading Exam is <u>25 minutes</u>.
- The total mark for the reading Exam is <u>20 marks X 2 = 40 marks</u>
 - The English Recruitment Exam passing mark is 60 % and above
- The candidate who passes the English written exam will have an Oral test (an Interview in English), on the same day
